WHAT IS THE POOL SAFELY GRANT PROGRAM?

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) *Pool Safely* Grant Program (PSGP or grant program) is offered to state, local and tribal governments for education, training and enforcement of pool safety requirements intended to save lives.

The grant program is made possible through the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act (VGB Act) and is a part of CPSC's national *Pool Safely* campaign to prevent drain entrapment and drowning. Drowning is the leading cause of deaths among young children.

Since 2007, CPSC has awarded 24 grants totaling nearly \$6 million in grants to assist jurisdictions in reducing deaths and injuries from drowning and drain entrapment incidents in pools and spas. This year, CPSC plans to award \$3.5 million in grants, ranging from \$50,000 to \$400,000.

WHO CAN APPLY?

- State governments
- City or township governments
- County governments
- Tribal governments

State and local programs can receive funding to continue this lifesaving work to reduce the risk of drowning.
