WHAT IS THE POOL SAFELY GRANT PROGRAM?

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) *Pool Safely* Grant Program (PSGP or grant program) offers state, local and tribal governments grant funds for education, training and enforcement of pool safety requirements intended to save lives.

The grant program is authorized through the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act (VGB Act) and is a part of CPSC's national *Pool Safely* campaign to prevent drain entrapment and drowning. Drowning is the leading cause of deaths among young children.

Since 2007, CPSC has awarded 32 grants totaling nearly \$8 million to assist jurisdictions in reducing deaths and injuries from drowning and drain entrapment incidents in pools and spas.
